Job Overview:

Be part of building a safer community at George Brown College, during historic times, through the Student Association’s SafeWalk program. SafeWalk is dedicated to providing safe and reliable accompaniment to folk’s destinations, including after dark. SafeWalk Walkers serve as welcoming ambassadors of the program and the SA. You’ll perform walk accompaniment duties to students, staff, faculty, and visitors. Through walk accompaniments, nightly safety audits, and detailed note taking – everything you take on makes you a trusted point person to the safety planning and routines that benefit all towards strengthening community and a safer campus climate.

You endorse and ensure meticulous standards in health and safety protocols, including COVID-19 protocol adherence and communications. SafeWalk also promotes trainings, safety awareness and health education broadly. You’ll participate in promotional outreach, videos, photos, and webinar creation relating to safety issues and the promotion of SafeWalk and the Student Association.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Policy and procedure adherence as instructed.
- Work cohesively with other SA SafeWalk staff; including SafeWalk Captains.
- Accompany users on walks (2 km max) including to transit stops, parking lots, through or to other buildings.
- Maintain safety, cleanliness, and accessibility of station areas.
- Participate in promotions of the program in ways that build awareness of the program, purpose, and benefits (e.g. tabling, virtual tabling, poster, surveys).
- Participate in aligned promotions on health, safety, and wellness in the program, and SA-wide where applicable.
- Positively support other Student Association programs, campaigns, and staff as needed.
- Respond or refer questions and comments from students, staff, faculty and visitors with care and timeliness.
- Maintain logs and records of all duties throughout a shift.
- Conduct detailed nightly campus audits, identifying and reporting potential safety hazards.
- Stay knowledgeable about the GBC campuses and surrounding areas; both the physical spaces (routes, directions) and campus programming (e.g. SA and GBC events, campaigns, services).
- Actively participate in trainings and learning opportunities (internal and external).
- Other duties as assigned.



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YOU HAVE:

- Effective written and oral communication skills.
- Keen observation and problem-solving skills; including situational awareness.
- Effective stress coping skills.
- Meticulous adherence to hygiene, health and safety protocols, including compliance to COVID-19 protocols.
- Demonstrated history of reliability and organization skills.
- Availability; able to work nights.
- Availability; able to work rotational shifts (minimum three nights of availability per week).
- Availability; able to work at all George Brown College campuses and satellite locations.
- Able to stand and walk repeatedly, multiple walks within 2km.
- Value equity, diversity, and inclusion.
- An understanding of the Student Association and the importance of the student movement.

- Related experience in front-line service/retail/hospitality, facilities, health and safety, etc.
- Previous experience in SafeWalk (as a user).
- Interest in areas of bike safety, transit campaigns, accessibility.
- Ability to speak more than one language is an asset.
- Sign language proficiency (ASL-English) is an asset.
- Completed trainings or certifications in First Aid, Mental Health, conflict prevention, etc. an asset.
- Understanding of impacts of COVID-19 on students, knowledge of Toronto related supports and referrals.
- Understanding of consent, and demonstrated commitment to ending gender-based violence on campus.
