Diving Deeper.

- A programming space has been secured for you folks at the new Limberlost Campus this year. This was countless rounds of negotiations over the years by four boards, alongside guidance from the General Manager
- We have introduced the Bounce app because building a community is important.
 You can see all students of George Brown College and our day-to-day events and activities, purchase tickets, and even start conversations with your fellow schoolmates from different campuses, all in one app
- We have donated for 270 SAGBC-directed student awards and bursaries (scholarships) that newly include a cost-of-living stipend fund (10 awards) and transition to studies scholarship
- We have donated to the Augmented Education program that empowers students with mental health and addiction histories through job-focused training in the culinary arts and construction fields. Committed to accessibility, this tuition-free program eliminates barriers, ensuring every student has the opportunity to thrive.
- We have adopted the "Hands Off Our Education!" campaign, a fight against Bill 33, which threatens to destabilize education in Ontario
- The SNAP's Nourish n' Go program has been extended to our TMU Campus. The board is aiming to make SNAP more accessible to students in our satellite campuses
- We have made space for newer tenants in the SA space by cutting ties with delinquent tenants
